- <u>Civic Leaders of Tomorrow Public Policy Fellowship</u> Continue to support and expand the MBPO Civic Leaders of Tomorrow Fellowship program, which promotes future leaders in public policy and advocacy through fellowship placements of undergraduate students at not-for-profit and community-based organizations in New York City. Fellows are placed at organizations advocating for underserved communities in a variety of issue areas. Fellows participate in seminars about City government and civic and policy issues at the MBPO.
