Sir:

I am pleased to report that the Agency was both diligent and successful in carrying out our Mission in 2010. In achieving this goal the Agency acted in accordance with our core values of:

- *Integrity and Honesty*
- Environmental Stewardship
- Fiscal Responsibility
- Excellence in Services

Our vision of being recognized as a world leader in local waste disposal and recycling solutions making our community one of the best places to live and work was achieved by our adherence to our mission and core values and recognized with several national awards received in 2010. I would like to take this opportunity to share with you, in detail, the results of 2010.

National & State Awards in 2010:

<u>First Place National Award:</u> Keep America Beautiful - for Outstanding Community Recycling Program

<u>First Place National Award:</u> Keep America Beautiful - for Excellence in Litter Reduction Program

National Award: US Composting Council - for Municipal Composting Program of the Year

NYS Award: NY State Association of Reduction, Reuse and Recycling (NYSAR3) - Recycling Team of the Year

Waste Reduction, Recycling & Disposal

In 2010, over 536,800 tons were recycled through mandatory and voluntary recycling (both residential and commercial) in the community, for a total recycling rate of 60% (www.ocrra.org/about_annual_reports.asp).

In 2010, the Waste-to-Energy Facility processed 315,385 tons of non-hazardous, non-recyclable waste (enough to overfill the Syracuse Carrier Dome) and, in doing so, generated 218,118-megawatt hours of electricity. The Facility's metal recovery systems recovered 9,000 tons of ferrous and non-ferrous metal for recycling, which would have otherwise ended up in a landfill. Lastly, 77,534 tons (24.6% of the original trash weight) of non-hazardous ash residue were sent to a landfill for use as alternative daily cover (http://www.ocrra.org/about_annual_reports.asp).

Reporting

The Agency received an unqualified, clean opinion from our external auditors for 2010 that is included in our annual report at our website
